"Probably the biggest philosophy is that two heads are better than one," Reese said of facing a business challenge.

That sounds simple in theory, but execution is key. For instance, Reese spearheaded an effort to blend products that

weren't up to the required quality level. She helped coordinate efforts with several teams of people to ensure safety and remain environmentally friendly but also to get the product out quickly for sales. 'It helps you by having leaders on (a) core team that are able to go and drive their project," Reese said.

Also, she said, "You want to make sure everybody understands what the critical (goal) is and that you focus resources on that and don't let them get distracted from that," Reese said.

When the tip of a relief flare at the company's McPherson plant was broken, the plant had to shut down until it could be fixed. Reese said everyone had to concentrate on the sole goal of fixing it to get the plant operational.

Reese said there's another benefit to letting everyone know an objective. "People are very creative and can come up with their own ways to meet those goals and objectives."
